Being a host family is an experience that will last a lifetime. The States' 4-H International Exchange Summer Inbound Program brings over 600 youth from around the globe to homes across America every summer. As **American** members of families. exchange participants experience the American way of life and share their own culture in a variety of ways. Hosting allows your family the opportunity to expand their global perspective, while opening a brandnew world to a young person from overseas. You and your family can join in this unique adventure by hosting this summer. All it takes is a warm heart, an open house, and a passion for international experiences.



Host Family Requirements

- Have a child living at home the same gender as the exchange delegate and within 4 years of age
- Provide meals for the exchange student as the family would for their natural child(ren)
- Delegate can share a room with host sibling, but must have their own bed
- No special activities or planning required
 our delegates want to experience being a member of an American family
- The program is voluntary no stipends are provided

FAQ

- How long does the exchange last?
 - Approximately 4 weeks from mid-July to mid-August. Check with your state coordinator for specific dates.
- · What age are the delegates?
 - Delegates are 12-18 years old
- . How do the youth travel?
 - In groups accompanied by an adult chaperone who stays in the same state for the duration of the program. Families without children at home are great for hosting our chaperones!
- What support does States' 4-H provide host families?
 - Trained State Coordinator(s) (often an Extension 4-H professional), orientations, handbooks, arrival & departure events, & more.
- Will my delegate speak English?
 - Expect very little English ability, but there are lots of other ways to communicate!
